Education Corner

We encourage all residents to complete MOLSTS (Medical Orders for Life Sustaining Treatment). This includes questions about Do Not Resuscitate orders, artificial ventilators and feeding tubes. While none of us want anything serious to happen, inevitably your loved one will eventually experience a major medical crisis. It is important to talk with your resident about what kinds of treatments they would like or not like to have. Knowing these answers prior to a crisis can make it easier to make decisions during critical situations. Questions to consider are: 1) What is their prognosis? 2) What resources are available at the nursing home to treat my loved one? 3) What are the burdens and benefits of aggressive treatments such as IVs, intubations, and tube feedings? 4) How does my loved one define their quality of life? When the burdens of living are greater than the joys of living, it may be time to let go. Hospice and comfort care/palliative care services are available to you and your loved one. Our social workers have resources available to you to help you better understand your options. Please see them for support and assistance.
